

## Second annual Beginning Artist Show

The second annual Beginning Artist Show was sponsored by the Seacoast Artist Guild and was held from April 18 through April 30th at the Applewood Pancake House in Litchfield. Eligible artists had to be at least 18 years of age with 3 years or less years of experience in 2D, 3D or photography. Art work was accepted for display on Sunday, April 18th between 2 and 4 PM at the Applewood Pancake House.

Prospectuses for the show were made available through Board Members of Seacoast, the Georgetown Cultural Council, Art Works and by contacting Marcelle or Walter Cushman, coordinators of this event. A special letter was also sent to Seacoast Art teachers with copies of the prospectus for any students who were eligible.
